



From the Presbyters Desk

Dear Friends in Christ, October is often seen as a turning point in the year. The harvest season reminds us of God's provision, while the gradual closing of the year points us to reflection and preparation. For many, October brings both gratitude for the months gone by and hope for the months ahead.

God is the Author of new beginnings. He is not limited by our past mistakes, our failures, or even our disappointments. In Isaiah 43, God tells Israel to stop dwelling on the past because He is doing something new. This message invites us to trust God for fresh starts and to embrace His new mercies this October.

1. Forget the Past - Don't Dwell There

God says: "Forget the former things; do not dwell on the past" (Isaiah 43:18). Israel was tempted to live in their memories—whether in past glories of Egypt's deliverance or the pain of Babylon's exile. But God wanted them to look forward. A driver cannot go forward if he is always staring in the rear-view mirror. The same is true for our spiritual journey. Philippians 3:13–14 – Paul says, "Forgetting what is behind and straining toward what is ahead, I press on toward the goal..." October is a reminder not to live in regret or nostalgia. God is calling us to trust Him for what lies ahead.

2. Embrace the New Thing God is Doing

God promises: "See, I am doing a new thing! Now it springs up; do you not perceive it?" (Isaiah 43:19). Character Example: Ruth, the Moabite

widow, left her past behind in Moab and trusted God in Bethlehem. Through that new beginning, she became part of the lineage of Jesus Christ (Ruth 1–4). Corrie Ten Boom once said, "Never be afraid to trust an unknown future to a known God." Farmers sow in hope, trusting that unseen seeds will produce a future harvest. In the same way, we must believe that God's new beginnings will bear fruit in our lives. What new thing is God birthing in you this month? A fresh ministry? A new relationship restored? A renewed passion for prayer and Scripture? Step into it with faith.

3. God Makes a Way Where There Seems to Be No Way

God says: "I am making a way in the wilderness and streams in the wasteland" (Isaiah 43:19). This means God can open doors where none exist. He can refresh us even in dry seasons. The Israelites at the Red Sea thought their story was over, but God opened a way through the waters (Exodus 14). "God will make a way, where there seems to be no way..." (Don Moen). This song echoes Isaiah's truth: God specializes in impossibilities. No matter how dry your October feels, trust that God can provide living water in your wilderness.

Beloved, October is not just another month—it is a season to embrace God's new beginnings. Forget the past, embrace His new work, and trust Him to make a way. Let us enter this month with hope, declaring: "Great is His faithfulness; His mercies are new every morning" (Lamentations 3:23).

As we step into October, having great faith in His promises, let us ask Him to help us to release our past, to embrace our new plans, and to walk with faith into the future we are preparing for us. May we see streams in our deserts and new life springing forth all around us.

Messages from the Pulpit

7th September 2025

1st reading—Ezekiel 3:16-21

2nd reading—Acts 20:28-32

Theme: 'The watchfulness required in the church today'

Message by Rev. Dr. Kenseelan Azariah

Being watchful is not just being prepared but also to prepare others. We must know that a responsibility is given to every Christian to preach the good news and also to alert the people of rejecting the message of the Gospel ("Son of man, I have made you a watchman for the house of Israel. Whenever you hear a word from my mouth, you shall give them warning from me" Ezekiel 3:17. The message of John 3:16 must be made known to the lost souls of the world, including our own. The church must be watchful of these three things as we stand in faith in God---* False teaching --- Matthew 7:15 teaches us to be careful of these "Watch out for false prophets. They come to you in sheep's clothing, but inwardly they are ferocious wolves". Therefore, study the word of God yourself. *Temptations of this world—James 4:4 rightly says "You adulterous people! Do you not know that friendship with the world is enmity with God? Therefore, whoever wishes to be a friend of the world makes himself an enemy of God". Walk circumspectly and watch and pray always. * Bitterness—Hebrews 12:15 -- 'See to it that no one fails to obtain the grace of God; that no "root of bitterness" springs up and causes trouble, and by it many become defiled'.

14th September 2025

1st reading – Numbers 14:1-10

2nd reading – Luke 13:10-17

Theme: 'God has called us to be free'

Message by Dr. Stanley Jones

When the people of Israel were in bondage of Pharoah in Egypt or during the times of the Judges or during the times of the exile to Babylon, God

has always delivered them. He never left them remain in chains and suffering. He acted on their behalf. During the great exodus from Egypt, God showed them mighty signs that HE is fighting for them, for their freedom and to make them as a nation. HE gave them a new identity and a new life. In the same way when humanity fell into sin in the garden of Eden, God did not abandon us. He sent HIS only Son to rescue us from the bondage of sin. Yet we underestimate the value of this freedom, and tend to lean towards going back to our old lives. Just as the Israelites who grumbled and complained in the wilderness and tested God, continued to live a life of disbelief even after witnessing the Mighty hand of God continuously, we too behave the same way. The Israelites desired the food (Onions and Garlic) of the Egyptians and despised Manna-the angelic food. They were wanting to go back to the land of slavery and misery and did not trust the plans that God had for them. Certain hindrances that keep us out of the freedom that God gives us----*the fear of the unknown: many times, we miss God's blessing because we fear stepping into the unknown. Faith and freedom go hand in hand. *The forgetfulness of God's power. *Rebellion against God. In Jesus we are no more slaves but are sons and daughters of God. He has delivered us and has promised to be with us. This is our identity as HIS new creation, washed and purified and set free from death in Jesus Christ. Step out of fear and walk in the faith of God's promise.

Theme: St Matthew's Day

Message by Rev. Kenseelan Azariah

The tax collectors were considered as unclean, outcast and sinners as they worked for the oppressing government (the Romans in Matthew's case.) When Jesus called Matthew, he did not ask questions but just

followed Christ. Even though he was rejected by his community, he was loved and accepted by Jesus Christ. The Bible says we cannot love this world if we are followers of Christ. Indeed, Matthew left his everything including his highly paid job, comfort and luxury for Christ's sake. Most of today's Christians just attend church, take part in the holy communion and go back to their old life and few are running ministries trying to change others. But the question we need to ask is that- "Do we share an intimate relationship with God?" Matthew never looked back in his walk with the Lord as he took his calling personal, so did the other disciples.

2nd Reading—1st Thessalonians 3:1-8

Theme: "Cost of Discipleship"

Message by Rev. Mithra

Do not concentrate on the familial love and do not prioritise the people in your life (family and friends) but love God with all your strength, life, mind and soul and this is what Jesus asks for. We are witnesses to ourselves for committing ourselves to love God first yet we fail to keep the commitment. Come what may, stand firm for the mission and purpose God called you for. Ruth was a gentile woman who followed Naomi, no matter what she had gone through, she remained faithful. We will pay the price for the failure of the commitment to God and His purpose. Most of us are extremely casual about God's grace and do not have any intimate relationship with HIM. He who does not carry his cross and follow Christ, cannot be his disciple. If we belong to the Lord, we should serve HIM and HIM alone. Stand firm for the truth of the Word of God.

CHILDREN'S CORNER

Have you ever felt too small or too ordinary to make a difference? That was exactly how Gideon felt when God called him to lead the Israelites. The Midianites were oppressing Israel, taking crops, and leaving the people in fear.



Gideon was hiding, thinking he could not do anything to help. But God appeared to him through an angel and said, "The Lord is with you, mighty warrior" (Judges 6:12). Even though Gideon doubted himself, God had a plan to use him to deliver His people. Gideon asked for signs to make sure it was really God speaking to him. He prepared a fleece and asked God to make it wet with dew while keeping the ground dry, and then the opposite the next day. God faithfully answered both times, showing Gideon that He was in control and that Gideon could trust Him completely (Judges 6:36-40).





When the time came to face the Midianites, Gideon's army was very large at first, but God told him to reduce it. He wanted to show that the victory would come from God's power, not human strength. In the end, Gideon took only 300 men and defeated a massive army using clever strategy and God's guidance (Judges 7:19-22).



This story reminds us that God can use anyone, no matter how ordinary they feel, and that faith in Him leads to victory over fear and obstacles.

- 1. God can use anyone, even someone who feels small or unimportant. Gideon did not see himself as a leader. He was hiding from the enemy and doubting his abilities. God chose him anyway. This reminds us that God looks at the heart, not outward appearances, and He can work through anyone who is willing to trust Him.
- 2. **Trusting God gives courage to face difficult situations.** Gideon was afraid of the Midianites and unsure of his own strength. By trusting God, he gained the courage to lead the Israelites into battle. When we trust God, we can face challenges with confidence because we know He is with us.
- 3. **God's help is stronger than numbers or human strength.** Even though Gideon had only 300 men, they defeated a massive army. God wants us to rely on Him, not just on our abilities or resources. When we let God guide us, what seems impossible becomes possible.
- 4. **Listening to God and following His guidance is important.** Gideon followed God's instructions carefully, from the signs with the fleece to the battle plan. This teaches us that God's guidance matters. When we listen and obey Him, we experience His wisdom and protection.
- 5. **Faith can overcome fear when we rely on God's plan.** Gideon's fear was real, but his faith in God allowed him to act despite it. Our fears may not disappear, but faith helps us move forward with confidence, knowing God is in control.

Family Retreat Report - 29 to 31 May 2025 | Lonavala

Theme: "Love One Another" - Leviticus 19:18

Overview

The Family Retreat of St. Paul's Church (CNI), Pune, held at Lonavala from May 29–31, 2025, brought together nearly 70 members across generations for three days of spiritual nourishment, fellowship, and reflection. Anchored on the theme "Love One Another," the retreat blended powerful scriptural teaching, lively group activities, worship, fellowship and community building.

Teaching & Devotion

The retreat featured deep and transformative teaching sessions from:

Rt. Rev. Silvans Christian, Bishop of Gujarat, who led six key sessions:

- 1. The Blessings of the First Family Highlighted the original blessings given to humanity: fellowship, stewardship, and calling.
- 2. Roadmap to Deliverance Drew from Bartimaeus' story to show the power of persistence and healing through faith in Jesus Christ.
- 3. "Yes, My Lord" Reflected on Peter's calling and how surrendering to Christ unlocks transformation and purpose.
- 4. Love Unleashes Divine Power Showed how love is the driving force behind God's miraculous work.
- 5. Love Unlocks Destiny Explained how love reclaims, realigns, and reactivates our purpose in Christ.
- 6. Radical Love of Jesus Illustrated the life-altering, boundary-breaking compassion of Christ that heals, forgives, and restores.

Rev. Dr. Kenseelan, who led daily morning devotions focused on the barriers to love:

o Pride – A silent barrier that replaces humility with self-centeredness.

- o Unforgiveness Blocks healing and keeps us chained to bitterness.
- o Comparison Breeds envy and steals joy, damaging relationships.

These sessions called the church toward humility, healing, and mutual celebration.

Bro. Paritosh Bhalerao, whose scripturally grounded sessions explored:

- o The centrality of love in the Law, the Prophets, and the teachings of Christ.
- o Love as the spark that unleashes divine power and aligns us with God's eternal plan.
- o A prophetic call to respond to divine love with full surrender and action.

Intercessory Prayer Time:

Participants gathered in groups for a focused time of intercession, covering global conflicts, our nation, the Church of North India (CNI), and our church. Hearts were united in prayer for peace, righteous leadership, spiritual revival, and God's continued guidance and provision for our congregation and its ministries.

Engagement & Fellowship

The retreat was not just about listening; it was alive with participation and joyful connection:

Evening Games organized by S. D. Rajkumar were a highlight for the youth and the young at heart, sparking laughter and bonding across age groups.

Post-Dinner Group Activities led by Rohit Bell and family brought the congregation together in fun-filled, meaningful interactions that created memories and reinforced unity.

Vision & Commitments Going Forward

The retreat stirred not only inspiration but a strong desire for tangible ministry action. The group discussions led to emanate some reactions from the groups and some points have been submitted as part of the report for consideration by the Pastor and Pastorate Committee:

1. Youth Ministry

Life Skill Sessions - Continue practical, values-based training for youth. Invite participants from other CNI churches to build inter-church fellowship.

Contemporary Service (2nd Sunday) - Reintroduce modern worship services to foster creative and spiritual engagement among youth.

SPYF Sunday (4th Sunday) - Dedicate the fourth Sunday each month to youth-led services under the SPYF banner. Currently it's on Fifth Sunday that the youth participate actively in the conduct of church service.

Youth Outreach - Actively connect with disconnected or hesitant youth.

o Identify & Reach Out: Map members area-wise for focused engagement.

o House Visits: Organize visits with YF seniors; involve the Pastor and elders

2. Outreach Initiatives

Feeding Ministry - Expand to three sessions per week to support the underprivileged.

Prayer Request Box -Set up a confidential system for members to share prayer needs.

Inclusive Programs - Plan seasonal events welcoming non-Christians, e.g., a special Christmas evening alongside the Christmas Tree program.

3. Wings of the Church

Set Clear Objectives - Each ministry wing to define actionable goals under the Pastor's guidance.

4. Altar Girls

Inclusive Participation - Introduce girls as altar servers to promote greater inclusivity in worship.

5. Bible Study Weekly Sessions (Leaders Identified; Announcements to be made)

Resume Tuesday or area-based Bible study groups to encourage scriptural engagement.

6. Children's Bible Program

Launch a VBS-style initiative during school holidays for children from CNI churches.

These recommendations form a roadmap for sustained spiritual growth, youth revival, and broader community impact, aligned with the retreat's call to "Love One Another."

Participant feedback analysis

High satisfaction across all areas, especially engagement, fellowship, and relevance of teachings.

A strong presence of adults aged 51–70 with suggestions for increased youth engagement and intergenerational mix.

Deep appreciation for the worship, biblical teaching, and the warmth of the community.

Constructive suggestions:

- o Extending retreat duration
- o More interactive sessions
- o Improved accommodation logistics and timing coordination


